

The second (and first standalone) topical meeting organized by the Nuclear Nonproliferation Policy Division, and co-sponsored by the Isotopes and Radiation Division and ANS Trinity Section, is being planned to take place in Santa Fe, New Mexico, in September 2016. Assured confirmation of nonproliferation presents many challenges to those tasked with development of tools and techniques for independent verification of key parameters. This topical meeting will provide a forum for policy makers to highlight existing gaps in capabilities, as well as for researchers to discuss new tools and techniques. Proposed topics will include panel discussions and sessions on current needs in proliferation detection, safeguards, treaty verification, and forensic analysis, among others. ESARDA Training Course

ESARDA and the European Commission's Joint Research Centre at Ispra, Italy (JRC Ispra) organized the 14th course on "Nuclear Safeguards and Non-Proliferation" which was held on March 23-27, 2015, at JRC Ispra. Some 70 participants from across the world attended this course, with lecturers coming from various organizations active in nonproliferation and international safeguards.

The course is open to master degree students, but also young professionals and international relations/law students. The course content covers the evolution of the NPT, the basis of international safeguards, description of the nuclear fuel cycle, international and regional NP treaties, and established institutions and organizations and verification methodologies next to also highlighting nuclear forensics and export control.
